

## Special Orders

## By Dick Henggeler, Historian



Some very valuable 388<sup>th</sup> history resides at Maxwell AFB in Montgomery, Alabama. The Air Force Historical Research Center holds the unit history files for the

388<sup>th</sup>. The history files basically contain the official documents generated each month. These include mission reports, special orders, daily bulletins, public relation pieces and monthly reports from many of the base operations. Just about every day a Special Order was issued. It consisted of one to two pages of a dozen or so items. Each item is a special order that specifies some action that is to be taken concerning one or more men.

The Special Orders have been of particular interest because they cite individuals and certain information about them - first and last name, rank, serial number, MOS, and unit. These orders provide many of the pieces of the big 388<sup>th</sup> puzzle.

The special orders describe a variety of mundane actions which include:

- Promotions or demotions
- Reassignment to other units
- Transfer into or out of the 388th
- Temporary duty
  - 0 Training
  - o Recreation pass to London
  - Rest and relaxation at a nearby 'resort'
  - o Laundry run

Occasionally more interesting tidbits can be found such as the formation of a court martial board or accident investigation committee.

The special orders could be considered the non combat diary of the 388<sup>th.</sup> They tell a very dry history of daily life but occasionally they reveal an interesting secret.



## THEODORE E. LAMBERT, SR.

Theodore "Ted" Edward Lambert, Sr., 91, passed away in Morrisville, VT on October 5. . He flew 31 missions as a 560th Sqd. engineer/top turret gunner, primarily on the Paul Kelly crew in *Millie K*. Awards included the DFC and Air Medal with 3 Oak Leaf Clusters.

Mr. Lambert moved to Morrisville in 1957 to take a position as manager of the B.F. Goodrich store. With his wife he went on to establish a number of successful businesses in Morrisville beginning with Lambert Tire Company. Their business ventures included real estate, liquid petroleum gas, furniture, antiques and collectibles, leasing, and handicapped equipment. He also worked as a broker for various realtors over the years. In 1974, he was diagnosed with Multiple Sclerosis, and while learning to live with his physical disability, developed home health equipment for people facing physical challenges. He held patents for handicapped-accessible equipment he designed.

Mr. Lambert was a 3rd degree knight in Knights of Columbus, Fr. Boivin Council; a lifetime member of the VFW and Past President of the Morrisville Rotary Club.
